KEYNOTE SPEAKER



General Paul J. LaCamera
Commander UNC/CFC/USFK

General Paul J. LaCamera assumed command of United Nations Command, ROK-U.S. Combined Forces Command, and United States Forces Korea (UNC/CFC/USFK) on July 2, 2021. A native of Westwood, MA, General LaCamera commissioned as an Infantry Officer from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1985. His education includes a Bachelor of Science from the U.S. Military Academy and a Master of Arts degree from the U.S. Naval War College. General LaCamera most recently served as the Commanding General of the United States Army's largest Service Component Command, U.S. Army Pacific (USARPAC), headquartered at Fort Shafter, Hawaii, with portions of the command forward deployed and based throughout the Indo-Pacific. During his 36 years of service, General LaCamera had the honor to lead and serve with members of all military branches, inter-agency colleagues, and coalition partners from platoon through corps, and a combined joint task force. General LaCamera's past assignments include: the 82d Airborne Division, XVIII Airborne Corps, U.S. Army Special Operations Command, and Joint Special Operations Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; 1st Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia; 4th Ranger Training Battalion, 3d Ranger Battalion and the 75th Ranger Regiment at Fort Benning, Georgia; 2d Ranger Battalion, Fort Lewis, Washington. 2d Infantry Division, Eighth United States Army, Republic of Korea; 10th Mountain Division (Light), Fort Drum, New York; 4th Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colorado; Office of Security Cooperation, Baghdad, Iraq; 25th Infantry Division, and U.S. Army Pacific, Hawaii. General LaCamera participated in numerous contingency operations including: Operation JUST CAUSE in Panama; Operation UPHOLD DEMOCRACY in Haiti; Operation ANACONDA in Afghanistan; and multiple deployments in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM in Afghanistan, Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, Operation NEW DAWN, and Operation INHERENT RESOLVE in Iraq and Syria.

Brigadier General Lee, Jae Soong
Director of C4I, J6, ROK Joint Chiefs of Staff

Brigadier General Lee, Jae-Soong is currently assigned as the Director of C4I, J6, Joint Chiefs of Staff, for the Republic of Korea. Brigadier General Lee graduated from the Korea Military Academy in 1994 and was commissioned as a signal officer. He received his Master's Degree in Electronic and Electric Engineering from US Air Force Institute of Technology in 2002, and his Ph.D in Electronics and Electric Engineering from Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (KAIST) in 2009. After promotion to Colonel while serving as commander for the 90th Communication Group, he was selected to serve as the Chief of C4I Support in the Republic of Korea Presidential Office. In 2019 while serving in ROK JCS, Strategic Planning Directorate as the Chief of System Fielding Branch, he was responsible for acquiring new C4I systems for the ROK military. For his next follow-on assignment, he served as the Chief of Battlefield System Development Branch, in ROK JCS and was instrumental in development of Combined and Joint C4I systems and Interoperability. Upon promotion to Brigadier General, while serving as the C4I director, G6, of Ground Operations Command (GOC), he successfully secured wartime combined mission capabilities for GOC and the Ground Component Command.
